This year an exciting DVD has been produced in association with RTE Sport, covering the subjects of Gaeilge, English, SESE and SPHE. This DVD will be of interest to pupils from first to sixth classes. A supplementary reading book for children which deals with the topic of healthy eating is also included in the pack.
