

The National Coach Development Team | Role Description

The National Coach Development Team is a standing, collaborative collection of the coach development personnel from across the Gaelic Games family.

Membership

Membership of the National Coach Development Team shall be comprised of:

- LGFA National Development Officer
- Camogie Association Coach Education and Development Coordinator
- GAA Learning & Development Officer
- GAA Provincial/Regional Coach Development Manager
- GAA Head of Coach & Player Development

Other representatives of coach developers, or specialists may be appointed to become members of the National Coach Development Team as agreed by the Games Development Committee (GDC), and National Coach Development Advisory Group.

Role

The National Coach Development Team shall be responsible for the development, implementation, and evaluation of the Coach Learning Space and Pathway. The Coach Learning Space and Pathway shall comprise learning opportunities for

- Club coaches incorporating core modules, workshops, community of practice, coaching practice and aligned to the F1, F2 and F3 Stages of the Player Pathway
- County Academy Coaches incorporating modules, workshops, community of practice, coaching practice and operating within the T1-T4 element of the Player Pathway
- All coaches wishing to specialise in the various sports science disciplines, including (but not limited to) Technical Proficiency, Performance Analysis, Athletic Development, Sports Psychology
- Inter County Coaches incorporating modules, workshops, community of practice, coaching practice and operating within the E element of the Player Pathway
