

FUNDING OPPORTUNITIES FOR GREEN CLUBS

The landscape for community, sustainability and sports funding is a dynamic one. This information sheet provides a non-exhaustive list of current and recurring funding opportunities that might be of interest to your club and includes some practical tips on what to consider when drafting and submitting funding applications.

TOP TIPS

- Follow the media channels and website of your local council for news of upcoming funding programmes
- **26 Counties:** Register with your Public Participation Network (PPN) to receive updates on funding opportunities in their council area. https://www.gov.ie/en/organisation-information/a58b8-community-groups-public--networks/
- Six counties: Stay up-to-date with any relevant funding opportunities sent to your club secretary. Ulster GAA are subscribed to a grants and funding information service (GrantTracker) and relevant opportunities are regularly communicated to clubs.

1 Keep Records

Having up-to-date and easier accessible records will make it a lot easier for you to report to funders, apply for new funding and to keep the club updated on you projects and successes. Some things to pay particular attention to are:

- Electronic and paper copies of all funding applications. Many grants have on-line applications forms so remember to print and save your own copy before you submit
- Receipts and Remittances. Keep and file copies of all receipts and records of spending, as proof for funding bodies, and of remittances of all grants and funding received, so the club is aware of the funding you are bringing in
- Take photos before, after and during your funded project, to report to funders, for award applications and for club communications
- Log all grants, e.g., on a spreadsheet or as a written, dated list for easier management of grants and projects, for reference for future grant applications and to report to the club, for examples at the AGM

2 Demonstrate Impact

Identifying and demonstrating impact is a key part of funding applications and a track record of impactful projects will increase your club's chances of success in future applications

- Specify who or what will benefit from your project e.g., young people, marginalised groups, older members of the club and community, the environment/planet
- Identify **the type of impact** the funded project will have; e.g. increasing participation (in sport, physical activity, community activities, environmental awareness), improving accessibility (physical and/or social), enhancing health & well-being, reducing carbon emissions, ü harm or resource waste
- Record and report the numbers and figures of your impact e.g., numbers attending funded events or training, numbers using club facilities, numbers benefitting from funded resource or projects, club membership numbers, reduction in club energy use or increase in on-site energy generation (kWh), reduction in waste (kg). reduction in water use or increase in water harvesting/reuse (m³/l), reduction in car travel (km)
- List any other **community groups** with which you will collaborate on the funded project and/or the **benefits to the community** from your project. Community impact is an increasingly important element of funding calls and grants
- Emphasise any **co-benefits** to your project e.g., inclusion and diversity, health & well-being, if the project is in a socio-economically deprived area

3 Miscellaneous Tips

- Keep your club bank details and a copy of a recent statement to hand so you have ready access them
 when filling out applications
- Success breeds success if you build up a track record of spending funding fully, appropriately and on time this good reputation will weigh well with funders
- Consider applying for awards some are attached to small grants and relevant awards one may strengthen future funding applications
- Many funding schemes ask for **three quotes** for project works or services give yourself the time to gather these before the funding deadline
- Funding applications can be very time consuming try to share the burden within the club or Green Team
- Funding applications can be very time consuming prioritise your applications by weighing the likely benefits and result against the time and effort required
