


In summary


• The GAA is concerned with all the people of Ireland, urban and rural. The problem is that the Association is weakest where the population is increasing; it is strongest where the population is declining. That problem has always been there but the extent of the adverse trends in recent years has now brought a full realisation of its seriousness for the Association

■ The greatest implications and challenges for the GAA of the future are to be found in **growing cities**, **larger settlements** across the country, **satellite towns** serving major cities and the increasing number of towns with populations of more than 5,000 people. The net result is that the **effects of urbanisation are being felt across the entire country**, including by village and rural clubs.



What are the issues?

- A shift eastwards nationally, and a shift from Rural to Urban across all Counties
 - Rural depopulation making amenities unviable shops, pubs, post office, banks etc
 - Smaller numbers of young children enrolling in Primary Schools –
 reduced teacher numbers/closure of small schools
 - Little/No rural housing development reducing the regeneration of the local population, forcing young people to move to planned urbanised areas
 - Previously separate clubs forming Independent Teams or amalgamating to enter competitions – loss of community identity
 - Possibility that facilities built up might not have sufficient use



What are the issues?

Growing Urbanisation

- Increasing memberships of urban clubs, resulting in significant requirements for coaches/club volunteers
- Lack of facilities to cater for all participants
- Significant costs towards providing facilities
- Children not getting sufficient game time leading to drop off
- Clubs becoming too large for their County structures can clubs grow to an infinite size / number of members?

Conversely:

- Many clubs in urban areas are struggling to recruit from within their communities
- Participation numbers might be high but overall penetration is low



Proposed Actions

- •Menu from which counties can select according to their needs:
 - Player Eligibility
 - Transfers / parish rule/ Sanctions/Parent rule
 - Permissions to play from urban to rural
 - Games Programmes:
 - Cross county / provincial games based on the Táin Óg principles
 - Smaller sided games
- County and Club Support Unit
 - Creating a structure designed to provide guidance, resources, and assistance to clubs. The goal is to ensure the sustainable growth and efficient management of clubs



Proposed Actions

- GAA counties and clubs find it difficult to engage with councils, agencies, governments, and government departments
 - We need enablers.
- External Government / Local Authority Engagement
 - Rural and urban planning
 - Development of Social Enterprises
 - Development of Urban Facilities
 - Access to funding
 - Job creation
 - Partnerships
