Creating a Culture -Values Backed up by Behaviours Psychological Safety

"The boys know that they can make mistakes. Football is a game of mistakes. But what is important is the reaction.

You lose the ball, you try to win it back. You conceded a goal, then go and try to score one.

If we want our teams to be creative then we can't punish them for mistakes" - Klopp "I won't tell you off if you misplace a pass or miss a header that costs us a goal as long as I know your giving 100%.

I can forgive you any mistake, but I wont forgive you if you do not give your heart and sole to this team" "There's always a plan and you will know your role inside out, but he also gives you the freedom to go and do your stuff.

He trusts you to make your own decisions." – Stephen O'Donnell
